#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures general : If you feel unwell, seek medical advice (show the label where possible).

### 4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

- Symptoms/injuries : Causes severe skin burns and eye damage. Causes damage to organs (thyroid gland) through prolonged or repeated exposure (if swallowed).
- Symptoms/injuries after inhalation : May cause respiratory irritation.
- Symptoms/injuries after skin contact : Caustic burns/corrosion of the skin.
- Symptoms/injuries after eye contact : Causes serious eye damage. Corrosion of the eye tissue. Permanent eye damage.

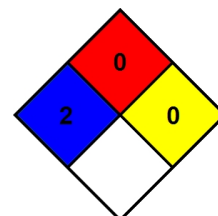
